Welcome

to the third issue of the BMS World Mission *Prayer Guide* 2023.

"Oh Lord, in the morning you hear my voice; in the morning I plead my case to you, and watch." (Psalm 5: 3, NRSV)

By the time I had the privilege of taking over from Laura as *Prayer Guide* editor, she had already commissioned our Nepal-based mission worker Jenny Saunders to pen the welcome to the last edition. It means I have had to wait until this my second issue to introduce myself.

Back in the summer of 2017, not long after becoming a Christian, I attended an event at Blackfriars Hall in Oxford. Father Andrew Pinsent, a Catholic priest and particle physicist, spoke that day about his time as a novitiate and of asking his spiritual director how he should be praying.

"Start with the psalms and then come back to me," was the reply. Father Pinsent has

a very big brain, five degrees, a DPhil and a PhD, and so he learnt all 150 by heart. The result was, he told us, "a cathedral in his mind", a place to which he could always return to meet with God.

I have never forgotten that phrase; it haunts me as part-challenge, part-promise. There are 125 days marked by this edition of the *Prayer Guide*. My brain isn't big enough to commit 125 psalms to heart, but I do commit to praying a psalm a day alongside that day's BMS prayer. And perhaps in so doing, I may be able to build at least a "chapel in my mind".

Creating safe spaces

27 Aug to 2 Sept

In James 1: 27 we are told to look after the widow and orphan. BMS World Mission takes this mandate seriously and looks to ensure all who encounter the organisation feel safe and are cared for with dignity and respect. This week we are praying for those working to create safe spaces for all.

☐ SUNDAY 27

Louise Lynch is our safeguarding champion for Asia. She works alongside our partners in Asia to encourage good, culturally appropriate policies and practices that promote safe spaces for all people. Pray for her as she navigates delicate conversations and cultural complexities.

☐ MONDAY 28

BMS has the privilege of working with others and telling stories of both joy and difficulty around the world. Pray that we would do this sensitively and wisely, honouring those who have trusted us with their life stories.

☐ TUESDAY 29

Today we pray for strength and wisdom for our partner the Uganda Christian Lawyers' Fellowship (UCLF). UCLF go into schools and communities to educate families about children's rights and protections, and support those who may need help bringing a legal case.

☐ WEDNESDAY 30

While in the UK safeguarding is understood, there are areas of the world where not all people are protected. Pray for those who live in these places, that all people will be safe and live without fear.

☐ THURSDAY 31

Pray for our BMS workers who are challenging exploitative cultures, creating safe spaces and standing up for the oppressed. Pray they would have courage to speak or act in ways that encourage others to think or act differently.

☐ FRIDAY 1

Pray for the BMS safeguarding team and for our Trustees with responsibility for safeguarding, that they would be wise in making decisions, implementing policies and supporting people in difficult situations.

☐ SATURDAY 2

BMS seeks to be an organisation where all people flourish. Pray that we would be able to fulfil that vision and would be a safe space for all.

Education

3-9 September

Education expert Brad Johnson writes that “relationships are the foundation of education”. Relationship is at the heart of all BMS seeks to do in the name of education. Pray that the glory of our Lord Jesus will be seen across our global educational programmes.

SUNDAY 3

In poor, rural areas of Bangladesh, BMS partner BBCS SHED runs the Children’s Education Project (CEP), with more than 30 church-led early learning centres. Please pray for excellent relationships with the children and their families.

MONDAY 4

Pray for BBCS SHED as it inducts a new Director, while also seeking a well qualified Lead Education Officer for the CEP. Pray that the early years educators will foster a love of learning among the children, creating a lasting legacy.

TUESDAY 5

Pray for BMS partner KISC EQUIP, who train teachers in Nepal, and BMS partner workers Dil and Krishna. Pray that their training seminars will bring about positive change in the classroom, and that strong friendships will permit crucial conversations about life and faith.

WEDNESDAY 6

Lift up BMS partner Kathmandu International Study Centre (KISC) in Nepal. Pray for the recruitment of excellent teachers who will provide high-quality education for their students.

THURSDAY 7

Covid-19 has affected our work in East Asia, but lecturers continue to build relationships online. Pray for good internet connections, which will facilitate student and lecturer interactions online.

FRIDAY 8

In Ghusel, Nepal, teachers asked for help to improve facilities. Pray for our partner MCDS as they serve this wonderfully resourceful community and guide people towards positive educational outcomes.

SATURDAY 9

Teachers have an eternal impact; they can never tell where their influence ends. Give thanks for a teacher who influenced you, that BMS-supported teachers will be godly examples.

Mobilising communities

10-16 September

BMS is starting to grow its Church and Community Mobilisation (CCM) work. In CCM, two things happen. Firstly, churches are encouraged to be more outward facing and see the positive role they can have in their communities. Secondly, churches are equipped to recognise the resources their communities already have, and to take ownership of the development they want to see.

SUNDAY 10

Thank God that through CCM, communities can recognise the resources they have and start using these to meet their needs. This has empowered people and given them a sense of ownership.

MONDAY 11

CCM helps people to see that poverty is not God's plan: there is potential within people to change their situations. Thank God that through the CCM Bible studies, people realise God has given us all gifts, talents and resources.

TUESDAY 12

Thank God for the 28 people in Nepal who are being trained to facilitate CCM. Praise God that CCM has enabled churches to build good relationships with community members and government officials. Churches have gained respect and recognition in their communities.

WEDNESDAY 13

Self-help groups are a key component of CCM. Thank God that through these groups people can save money and access loans, enabling them to start businesses and meet their needs.

THURSDAY 14

CCM uses Bible studies to help churches consider what it means to be "salt and light". Thank God that in Nepal this has led to Christians supporting the most vulnerable in the community.

FRIDAY 15

In Uganda, BMS partner JLH is planning to start CCM. Pray for them as they make their plans and identify facilitators to be trained.

SATURDAY 16

The widow in 2 Kings 4: 1-7 thought her situation was hopeless. But she learnt that a mere drop of oil could be used to overcome her challenges. Praise God that CCM gives communities hope.

Mozambique

17-23 September

Mozambique gained independence less than 50 years ago. It's developing rapidly in its cities, while subsistence farming is still the norm in most rural areas. The threat of hurricanes is very real, and the country is still recovering from the damage caused by Cyclone Idai in 2019.

SUNDAY 17

Pray for peace in Cabo Delgado Province, where an Islamist group has been killing people since 2017 and many people have been displaced from their homes.

MONDAY 18

The new board of the Baptist Convention of Mozambique took up its responsibilities in August. Ask God to give them wisdom and vision, and pray that they will govern with transparency and strong leadership so that believers in their churches will grow in their faith.

TUESDAY 19

Carlos Jone has been appointed as temporary pastor of the First Baptist Church in Beira following the death of Pastor Mosse. Pray for strength and wisdom as he leads the church while also working with self-help groups and supporting farmers in an agroforestry project in Sussundenga.

WEDNESDAY 20

Elections in October will appoint the mayors in many cities. Pray that this process will be peaceful and that all parties will accept the results.

THURSDAY 21

Lift up a new sewing project for widows and the most marginalised in Beira. Pray that it will provide a sustainable income for those in the greatest need.

FRIDAY 22

AMAC provides legal aid and mediation services for vulnerable people in Beira and Maputo. Pray that this work will bring justice to many who would otherwise be unable to access legal services.

SATURDAY 23

BMS worker Jane Edwards supports AMAC in their Beira and Maputo offices. Pray that their legal education work will raise awareness of family, land and labour laws and protect the rights of widows, women and children.

Afghanistan

24-30 September

Since the arrival of the de facto government in 2021, the work performed by international organisations in Afghanistan, including BMS' local partner, has been hit by bans targeting the participation of women and girls in public life. This week, we lift up this troubled nation to the Lord.

SUNDAY 24

Pray that the de facto government will be moved by compassion and will fully identify with the Afghan people's many needs. May the government promote a climate of freedom instead of oppression and fear, mercy instead of inhumane bans, and forgiveness instead of hate.

MONDAY 25

Pray for the security situation in Afghanistan and for physical safety for BMS' local partner staff, their families and those served through their work. Pray especially for safe travel in their daily commutes.

TUESDAY 26

Lift up BMS' local partner's distribution of food and basic supplies to support the poorest families while they wait for the agricultural season. Pray that the rainy season will be on time and the harvest will be plentiful.

WEDNESDAY 27

Pray for physical and spiritual protection for BMS worker Ruby. Pray that her agricultural work produces not just food to sustain a family's physical needs, but fruits of hope for a better future.

THURSDAY 28

Remember Afghan women and girls who are stuck at home, banned from primary, secondary and university education. Pray that they will soon be able to resume their studies.

FRIDAY 29

Lift up BMS workers Arthur and Reeta as they continue learning the language and culture. Pray for strong local friendships, and that they will experience God's presence in all they do.

SATURDAY 30

Pray for the leaders of BMS' local partner. Ask God to grant them protection, freedom, wisdom, creativity and the resources needed to continue supporting those living in poverty.

Uganda

1-7 October

Uganda is a beautiful country, but opportunities to grow abundant food have been stolen because of poverty, changing weather, cost of living crises, and knowledge lost during the civil war. Through our *Days of Plenty Harvest* appeal, you and BMS World Mission partners are coming alongside farmers to help navigate these challenges.

BMS agriculturist **Genesis Acaye** has been key to developing relationships of trust with the farmers. Please pray for protection over Genesis and his family as he continues to build new relationships.

☐ MONDAY 2

JLH are always looking to grow the number of their workers who can meet the spiritual needs of people in Gulu, northern Uganda. Please pray for the extra funding required to cover the wages of these workers.

☐ THURSDAY 5

Barbara and her family are at the heart of the appeal. Pray that this harvest, families like Barbara's in Uganda and across the world would experience the abundant life made possible by Jesus.

☐ TUESDAY 3

Cek Cam is a collective established to give farmers the chance to sell their crop in bulk as a response to rapacious buyers. Please pray for the prophetic imagination that leads to such initiatives, where the good of the people wins out against Mammon.

☐ FRIDAY 6

Thank God that through gifts given at harvest time and the work done by Genesis and his team, generations in Uganda will be blessed.

☐ SATURDAY 7

Ask God to protect farmers in Gulu from the threats of poverty and climate change, and pray that their children will grow up healthy and safe.



Much of the relief work in vulnerable countries such as Nepal is preparing buildings and communities for the sadly inevitable disasters.

Relief

8-14 October

Every year, countries around the world face multiple crises. BMS World Mission's partners based in and near affected communities are quick to respond, ensuring the right support is given at the right time. Pray for those responding, both in prayer and action, that they would have wisdom, energy and sufficient resources.

☐ SUNDAY 8

Pray for churches on the ground who play a key part in BMS' relief responses, who often find themselves in the midst of a crisis with no warning. Pray they will be places of safety and hope for the communities around them.

☐ MONDAY 9

Climate uncertainty and insecurity is impacting the most vulnerable with erratic rainfall, higher temperatures and stronger storms. As BMS responds to the impacts of these events, pray that we will be able to increase communities' resilience.

☐ TUESDAY 10

Back in February you gave so generously as BMS responded through our partners to the earthquakes and aftershocks in Türkiye (formerly Turkey) and Syria. Please pray as the work of rebuilding continues.

☐ WEDNESDAY 11

Earlier this year BMS responded to the relief effort in northern Peru following the widespread destruction caused by Cyclone Yaku. Many of the 50,000 people made homeless remain in temporary shelter. Please pray for them.

☐ THURSDAY 12

The aftereffects of Covid-19 may have faded mostly into the background in the United Kingdom, but for many of BMS' partners, life is only just resetting. Please pray for life anew in these places.

☐ FRIDAY 13

BMS' relief work is about preparedness as well as response. Please pray for the work being done to develop Namuna Hospital in Nepal so they may become responders and not victims.

☐ SATURDAY 14

In a broken world, peace comes dripping slowly, but with peace, communities flourish. Pray for places facing crises where conflicts rise, that they will experience peace in Jesus.

Equipping emerging leaders

15-21 October

BMS World Mission recognises the future of mission movements lies in equipping, training and working with partners across the world to help develop their emerging leaders. Thank God for this vision of building capacity and developing missional leaders in God's Kingdom.

□ SUNDAY 15

BMS-supported workers Baptist John Jaya Prakash and Koffi Soké Kpomgbe are the regional leaders of the Baptist World Alliance 'Horizons' training programme for youth and children's work. Pray that young people across India and Africa will join this programme.

□ MONDAY 16

Pray that we will successfully support the sending and training of mission workers through our partners the Global Institute of Vocational Excellence, Biglife in India and the Asia-Pacific Baptist Federation.

□ TUESDAY 17

Pray for the All Nations Christian College collaboration for mission preparation. Pray for the staff from All Nations and BMS working together, that they will provide high-quality mission preparation training and learning.

□ WEDNESDAY 18

Pray for Bijoy Sangma, our Indian-born, India-based Director of Intercultural Learning and Collaboration (ILC) and the ILC team at BMS. Ask God to open new doors for them to collaborate with global partners.

□ THURSDAY 19

Pray for BMS partnerships among the academic community, that they will spread practical wisdom across Europe, the Middle East and Central Asia.

□ FRIDAY 20

Humble leadership is vital for the work of the global Church and mission. Pray for all who provide guidance for the development of emerging leaders within BMS.

□ SATURDAY 21

Pray for new programmes for emerging leaders with a focus on gender and women in leadership, that they will support women in leadership at all levels across various roles.

Albania

22-28 October

From World War Two until 1991, Albania was an isolationist and communist state. Soon after the establishment of the democratic Republic of Albania, BMS World Mission began working in the country. Fast-forward three decades, and BMS' formal partnerships in Albania are due to finish at the end of this year.

Rejoice that Tek Ura (a charity started in 2016 by BMS and the ABU to serve vulnerable communities) is bringing transformation to many through the commitment and witness of its leaders and staff.

☐ WEDNESDAY 25



Give thanks for the years BMS workers **Dan** and **Annie Dupree** have spent in Albania. Praise God for their gifts of mentoring and leadership, enabling Tek Ura to establish a strong national team.

☐ THURSDAY 26

Lift up the Dupree family as they continue to discern their place of service after summer 2024.

☐ FRIDAY 27

Pray for the thousands of Albanians who have been influenced through youth camps, food banks, the ABU, Tek Ura, local pastors, BMS mission workers and volunteers. Pray that these seeds would bear fruit.

☐ SATURDAY 28

Many Albanians have moved across Europe seeking new opportunities. Pray that they would find "life in all its fullness", and ask God for an opportunity to bring hope to an Albanian local to you.

Israel-Palestine

19-25 November

This week we pray for a region geographically small, but large in its impact on world affairs. In previous years BMS World Mission partnered mostly with peace and reconciliation organisations, and their work and impact continues today. Currently, BMS strategically prioritises work with people on the move within the country.

SUNDAY 19

Give thanks for the 12 years of partnership between BMS and the Association of Baptist Churches in Israel. Praise God for new churches planted, churches revitalised, Nazareth Evangelical College, and youth and family ministries.

MONDAY 20

Pray for the Association of Baptist Churches in Israel as the partnership with BMS finishes at the end of this year. Pray that they will be able to employ a full-time Executive Director, that their plans will prosper and that the Association and the churches will be a blessing to the nation.

TUESDAY 21

Pray that those who feel they have no influence on the peace process, but live with the daily consequences of decisions made by others, will know that God hears.

WEDNESDAY 22

BMS partner Bethlehem Bible College (BBC) trains people for ministries throughout the Arab-speaking world. Pray that the college would have the staff and facilities it needs.

THURSDAY 23

BMS contributes towards BBC student scholarships. Pray that those who study would grow both in theological knowledge and personal maturity.

FRIDAY 24

Pray for our partner the Shepherd Society in their humanitarian work in and around Bethlehem and with displaced people in Jordan. Pray that the people they work among would receive Christ's love as well as material aid.

SATURDAY 25

Intercede for all who have a role in contributing to peace in the Holy Land. Ask that they will be reminded daily to do their part, no matter what others are doing.

Creation stewardship

26 Nov to 2 Dec

Through Scripture, we understand that Jesus Christ is not only Lord and Saviour of the world, but also its Creator, as part of the Trinity. In taking the gospel of Jesus to communities where he is unknown, we're passionate to present the whole person: our Saviour and Creator.

SUNDAY 26

Praise God for winter – even the dark days show us the significance of Jesus as the Light of the World, and the evergreen conifers remind us that his life eternal has overcome death. Praise Jesus!

MONDAY 27

BMS can use creation stewardship to share God's love with communities in countries where we are not permitted to preach the gospel directly. Pray that the solar projects in Chad and the 'food forest' project in Afghanistan would provide opportunities to share Jesus.

TUESDAY 28

Each year we run online creation stewardship workshops for BMS' UK staff, mission workers and partners. Pray that these workshops would lead to real change in our awareness and actions, both at work and at home.

When conflict is navigated and land rights are established, local communities can develop their land to provide enough income for their households.
